My Dear Sir.

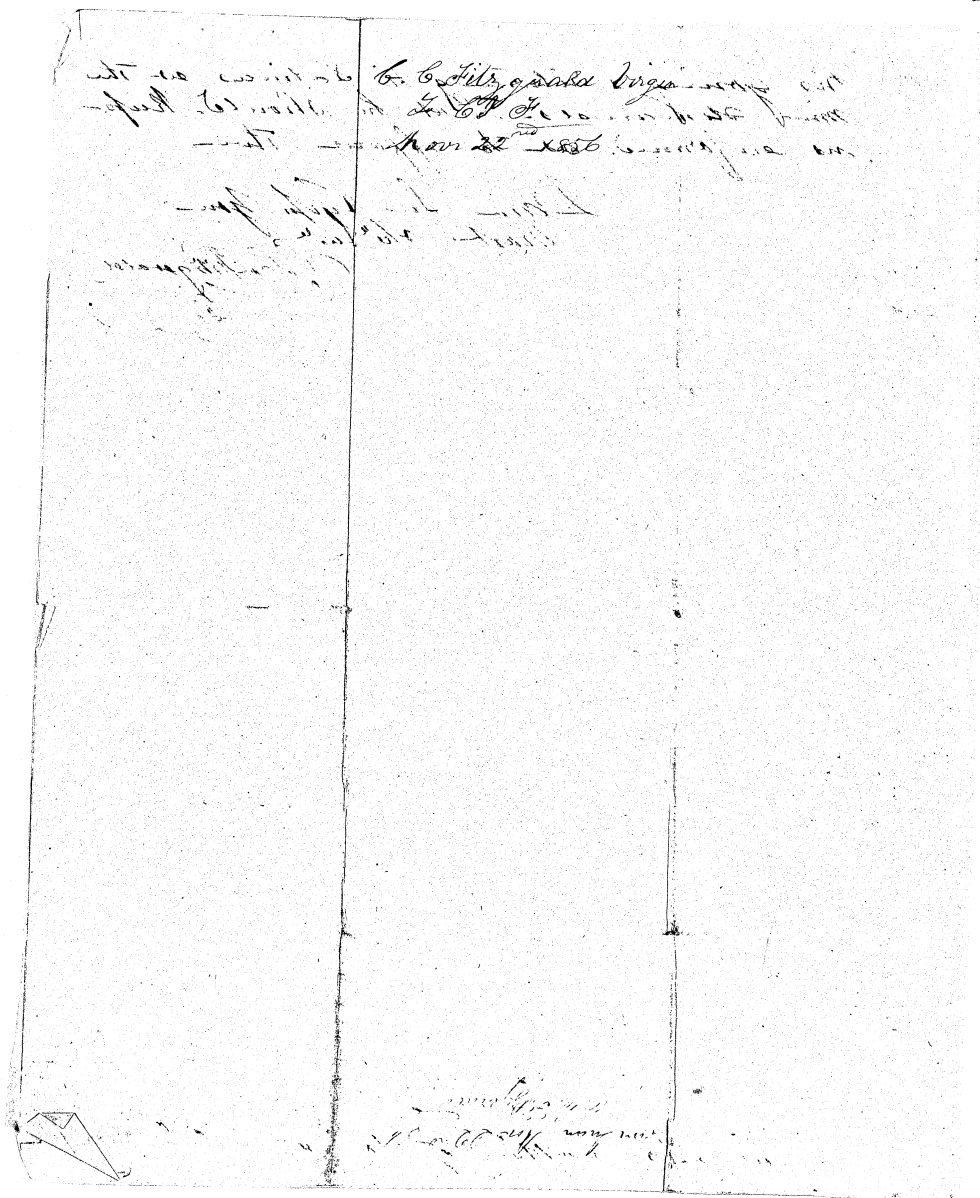
The bearer Don Adolfo -
is a person interested either in or in
the coal mine & has the boat
Cecilia formerly of La Corkhill
& Clapp

Said boat came onto
his possession by bringing it on
the beach on Salinas Pt. as
the ship Corkhill informed him
of Don Adolfo's intention to take it if he
wanted it he alone & repaired
it, he informs me the boat was
taken from him on his arrival at
San Juan. and the necessity of his
immediate return to Salinas caused me
to be a security that if his possession
is not lawful the boat will be returned
to Don Walker. has forwarded an order
to have it return to him. but not
knowing whether to you or the Co.
I have advised you this explanation
there is nothing to apprehend from

his going & returning to Latinus at the
most convenient - that he should keep
us informed as to affairs there

I have intended going to
Guatemala to put the proper protests
and claims against the Castor Kew & Co. to
procure a vessel to liberate one of the
Gentlemen belonging to our Coast since
now a prisoner in Guana Castor. I have
given him a certificate as to the cause of
his entering this port. (Blockaded) and if
you will be so kind as to certify that
he was brought in by your vessel it
will render everything clear, on his arrival
at Guatemala.
